

PATIENT PROFILE

- 72 year old male, hospitalized for 5 days.
- Resident at ERCC for 32 days.
- Diagnosed with Pubic Rami Fracture
- Was independent with activities of daily living prior to health complications that led to the fracture.


Mr. H was referred to ERCC for rehabilitation following a fall at home in which he sustained a pubic rami fracture. Prior to the fall, he had been hospitalized secondary shingles and other health complications. He presented with severe pain, weakness and decreased activity tolerance.

Mr. H was evaluated by Physical Therapy (PT) and Occupational Therapy (OT) at ERCC. His treatment focused gait training, upper and lower extremity strengthening, activities of daily living, and adaptive equipment.




THERAPY OUTCOMES
