



PATIENT PROFILE


- 85 year old male
- Hospitalized for 28 days following a motor vehicle accident which caused multiple fractures and muscle weakness throughout his body.
- Resident at ERCC for 48 Days
- Lived independently at home alone with daily visits from his son, premorbidly.

Mr. C came to ERCC after suffering multiple fractures and muscle weakness throughout his body following a motor vehicle accident. He arrived at ERCC in a great deal of pain and was at maximum assistance for nearly every activity. He was unable to dress, toilet, or groom himself and was unwilling to eat due to lack of appetite.


Mr. C was evaluated by Physical Therapy (PT), Occupational Therapy (OT), and Speech Language Pathology (SLP) at ERCC. He progressed with therapy over several weeks consisting of rigorous exercise, dynamic standing activities, ambulation, and activities of daily living. SLP helped Mr. C return to eating a normal diet and regain his appetite.


PHYSICAL THERAPY
