

PATIENT PROFILE:


- 82 year old female, hospitalized for 6 days.
- Resident at ERCC for 57 days.
- Diagnosed with open reduction and internal fixation of ankle.
- Lived independently with her husband.

Mrs. E came to ERCC after being hospitalized with a right ankle fracture following a lawnmower accident. Upon admission to Eagle Pointe, her ankle was in a case and she was 50% weight bearing on the right lower extremities.

Mrs. E was evaluated by Physical Therapy (PT) and Occupational Therapy (OT) at ERCC. Her treatment focused on gait training, upper and lower extremity strengthening, activities of daily living, and adaptive equipment.

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RESULTS:

After undergoing treatment at ERCC, Mrs. E was able to negotiate stairs to enter her home, ambulate independently with a walker, complete dressing and bathing with Stand By assistance, and was independent with toileting.
