After being “rescued” by Elkins Rehabilitation & Care Center (ERCC) in 2021, the facility received a new facelift and remodel. It is now in a better position for the future than ever in its history.

Seibert’s last day at the facility was May 29. He said he is looking forward to working on his farm and traveling with his wife.

“We’re looking forward to enjoying the golden years as they call them,” he said.
